HOST ORGANIZATION

BENEFITS

- Engage bright, motivated students at no cost
- Utilize students for specific projects or tasks. Internships typically run for approximately 30 hours per week for 6-10 weeks between May and August.
- Request specific student skill set to supplement organization's work
- Expand future recruiting and/or fundraising network
- Receive IIIP staff support to ensure internship success

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Design an engaging, meaningful work experience for students
- Identify on-site supervisor with some degree of English language proficiency
- Coordinate in-country logistics, including housing, in conjunction with IIIP staff.
- Provide support for student interns, in case of an emergency
- Provide weekly feedback to the intern and complete a mid-term and final evaluation for the program
- Provide any necessary documentation for visa
 processing
- Sign an International Internship Agreement

CRITERIA

- Clear mission and vision
- Must have some operations outside of the USA
- Offer supervised, project-based work for students
- Minimum of five employees
- Maintain a Commercial General Liability Policy (CGL Policy)

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ENGAGE WITH IIIP

The <u>lacocca International Internship Program (IIIP)</u> works with host organizations around the world to provide practical work experience, grounded in a global context, aimed at enhancing students' career readiness and intercultural competency. In the first 11-years of the program, **700 students** have worked in organizations located across **58 countries**. IIIP partners with NGOs, multinational companies, government agencies, institutes of higher education, etc. to host students. **There is no cost to the host organization**. IIIP covers the majority of the students' expenses - including airfare, transportation, housing, meals and incidentals. IIIP also provides student and supervisor support before, during and after the internship.

GREECE

IIIP has a long-standing, successful program model for student experiential learning through international internships, which includes an eight-month student-driven learning curriculum. **To date, IIIP has sent 700 students to intern across 58 countries,** which has not yet included Greece. We are eager to partner to send Lehigh student interns to Greece.

Key Areas of Potential Collaboration:

- Theme-based internships, on topics such as: population migration, environmental sustainability, community development, developing economic structure, entrepreneurialism, ESL or other timely topics
- Internship opportunities in business or health disciplines
- Potential to partner with other higher education institutions for joint internships (for example, two Lehigh student interns and two X student interns)
- Higher student demand for industry-based internships vs. research internships at the university level
