

Iacocca International Internship Program (IIIP) Request for Proposals Faculty/Staff-Led theme-based internships - Summer 2020

Submission Deadline: September 24, 2019

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Office of International Affairs supports the Lehigh University vision of an education "grounded in fundamental, transferable skills across all disciplines and in real world challenges" with a variety of applied global learning experiences. One of the most distinctive is the lacocca International Internship Program (IIIP), in which students live and work overseas for six to ten weeks, getting real-world professional experience while being immersed in a new culture. Through these immersive experiences, students develop intercultural competency, self-efficacy, and career readiness skills.

In providing the initial funding to create the lacocca International Internship Program, Lee lacocca '45 explained: "The idea for the lacocca International Internships emerged from the questions: How do you go about building global leadership? How do you demonstrate to people from different worlds that their commonalities are greater than their differences? By putting together cross-cultural situations, students are under pressure to perform by working through their cultural differences. They say yes to globalization, yes to cooperation. The students' enthusiasm is infectious and I would like to think it will infect the world."

In the eight years since the program's inception, nearly 600 students have interned in 50 countries. IIIP has become highly competitive within our student body and recognized nationally as a model for international experiences. In 2019, the Institute of International Education (IIE) awarded the program the Andrew Heiskell Awards for Innovation in International Education in the student mobility category.

The overarching IIIP portfolio changes on an annual basis and is intentionally diverse to attract students from many disciplines. A critical goal of the program is to expand access to international experiences. All Lehigh University students are eligible for consideration. The selection process is holistic with a myriad of criteria and an emphasis on financial aid status and lack of previous international experience among the top two criterion.

THEME-BASED INTERNSHIPS (formerly referred to as IIIP group internships)

Lehigh faculty and staff lead students on lacocca Internships, typically in groups of four to a maximum of six students. Faculty/Staff-led theme-based internships intend to meet the following objectives:

- Explore a particular academic or program theme
- Enable a broader geographic reach, especially in locations where students are less likely to travel independently



- Expand upon institutional partnerships
- Create opportunities for research collaboration where faculty/staff may have existing relationships at host sites

The annual selection process for Faculty/Staff-led theme-based internships is competitive for faculty/staff. The IIIP Steering Committee, in conjunction with the Vice President and Vice Provost for International Affairs, fund Faculty/Staff-led theme-based internships that offer meaningful student experiences at reasonable costs.

Selection criteria for Faculty/Staff-led theme-based internships include:

- Alignment with university's internationalization plan
- Balance of IIIP portfolio across locations, disciplines, number of students, etc.
- Internship description includes meaningful work aligned with intentional learning outcomes
- Understanding of logistical plans (housing accommodations, ground transportation, etc.)
- Cost
- Location

The IIIP funds are not intended as permanent funding for Faculty/Staff-led theme-based internships. Faculty/Staff theme-based internships funded for three years, in most cases, will not be renewed, depending upon the types/locations of placements needed to support the IIIP portfolio. Please contact Carol Strange if you are considering a request that will extend support beyond three years.

Faculty/Staff leaders of theme-based internships will work within the IIIP policies and procedures while developing the program, plan the logistics, prepare students for the work experience and cultural immersion, mentor students throughout the internship, and manage the budget. Faculty/Staff leaders are typically, but not always, on-site for the first week of the program. Faculty/Staff leader expectations are clearly stated in meetings with IIIP staff as well as a Faculty/Staff IIIP Leader Agreement.

FACULTY/STAFF LEADERS FOR THEME-BASED INTERNSHIPS

Please contact Carol Strange to learn more about the administrative responsibilities of leading a theme-based internship. IIIP theme-based internships fall within the overarching structure and corresponding funding of the lacocca International Internship Program. Designated faculty/staff leaders will be generally responsible for logistical arrangements, relationship management, liaison with host organization and LU/IIIP, student preparation specific to country and internship, budget management, and support of crisis management protocol if and as needed. IIIP staff oversee and support faculty/staff responsibilities.

FUNDING

Internships are mostly funded. IIIP covers the following expenses for students and one faculty member:

- Airfare (one-round trip only per faculty/staff and all students)
- Housing
- Allowance for most, not all, meals
- Allowance for in-country ground transportation, not US ground transportation



Funding is available only for the specific dates of the program. It does not cover:

- Passport application fees
- Visa application fees
- Immunizations
- Weekend excursions or travel expenses beyond program parameters and not specified in the themebased internship budget
- International phone plans/ SIM cards

IIIP LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Students will seek out and actively engage in cross-cultural interactions.
- Students will approach new ideas and understandings by being intellectually curious and culturally open-minded through successful navigation of international organizations.
- Students will demonstrate an awareness of and appreciation for cultural differences.
- Students will be able to position their own worldview in relation to other global perspectives.
- Students will make gains in cultural and professional competency areas through application of theory in a practical setting.
- Students will be impacted by, and make meaningful contributions to, the internship organization.
- Students will refine career aspirations and reshape their career trajectories through applied learning abroad.
- Students will demonstrate professional behaviors as they progress through iiPATH and begin marketing themselves for employment.

STUDENT SELECTION

The IIIP Steering Committee has implemented a holistic selection process that prioritizes financial need and lack of previous international experience, particularly on a Lehigh program. Input from faculty/staff leaders will be sought prior to the Steering Committee's selection meeting. The program director, IIIP Steering Committee and vice president and vice provost for international affairs have final decision-making authority to ensure the appropriate distribution of internships and students in the program at large as well as budget considerations.

Additional selection criteria:

- Student preferences (each student will note their top three preferences in their application)
- Alignment of student academic background and interests with the host organization needs and corresponding position description
- Class year (all student eligible with greater consideration for upper classmen)
- Language capabilities, as applicable
- Academic success
- Extracurricular activities as relevant to the experience

Because student preference is a selection factor, some internships (individual and/or theme-based) can potentially go un-filled at the discretion of the program director, IIIP Steering Committee, and/or VP OIA.



Due to grant stipulations, international students are not eligible for internships in Asia or Southeast Asia through summer 2021.

PROPOSAL SUBMISSION PROCESS

Faculty and staff interested in applying for lacocca funding for a theme-based internship in summer 2020 must submit a proposal based upon the following template, including a detailed budget, to Carol Strange at csh205@lehigh.edu by **September 24, 2019**.

For approved Faculty/Staff-led theme-based internships, an index will created within the lacocca International Internship Program budget. Faculty/Staff Leaders must adhere to the IIIP the Faculty/Staff Leader Agreement, including financial reporting.

IIIP Faculty/Staff theme-based internships - PROPOSAL TEMPLATE

Please submit your complete proposal by **September 24, 2019**. Only completed proposals received by this deadline will be considered. Note that the proposal process has changed from past years and that the following components must be detailed. Proposals should not exceed two pages, excluding the budget spreadsheet and the cover sheet. Please reference samples of successful proposals here.

A complete proposal will include:

- Executive Summary
- Goals and Objectives
- Internship Description and Schedule
- Outcomes from Previous IIIP Awards (if applicable)
- Detailed Budget

Descriptions should specifically address each of the following:

- Summary of internship experience, including a description of the intended student projects and responsibilities
- Partnering organizations or agencies, including previous experience with the partner(s)
- The role for the faculty/staff member participating in the internship, their experience with the partner or specific project, and the dates on which the faculty member will be traveling with the students
- How the proposed group program advances the goals for the lacocca International Internship Program and/or Lehigh's Internationalization Plan.
- Tentative schedule for the group internship program, including dates of student and faculty travel and professional and cultural activities
- Qualifications or profile of those students' best prepared for this specific program, including relevant majors, previous experiences, etc. These will be referenced as part of student selection by the IIIP Steering Committee.
