

Saimonth, a double major in electrical engineering and physics, was one of only 441 students nationwide to earn the prestigious Goldwater Scholarship in 2025. His research under Professor Ivan Biaggio explores rubrene, an organic semiconductor that transmits information through light and may advance quantum computing and renewable energy.

A first-generation college student and Air National Guard radio frequency operator, Muñoz is also studying machine learning applications for energy systems in Lehigh's INTEGRITY Lab. He hopes to pursue a Ph.D. in quantum computing and inspire others through his dedication to science, service, and societal impact.


