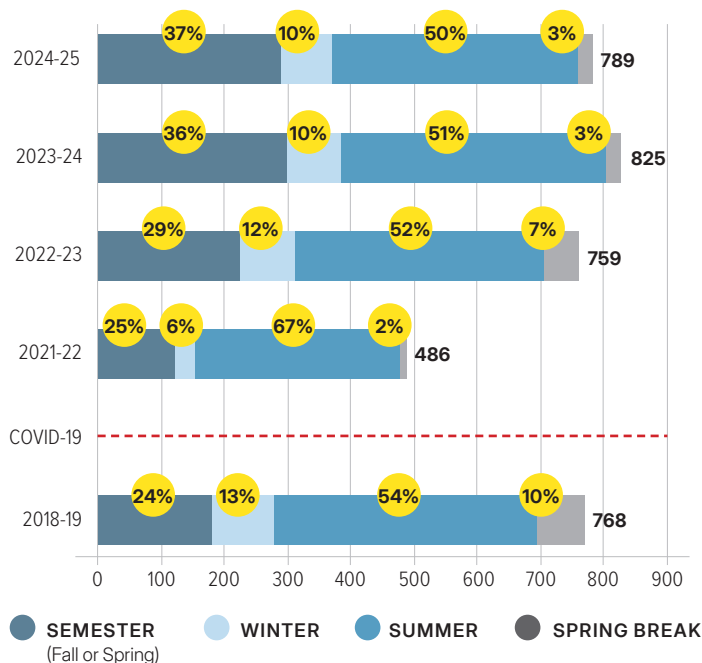

Julia Rock-Torcivia '25

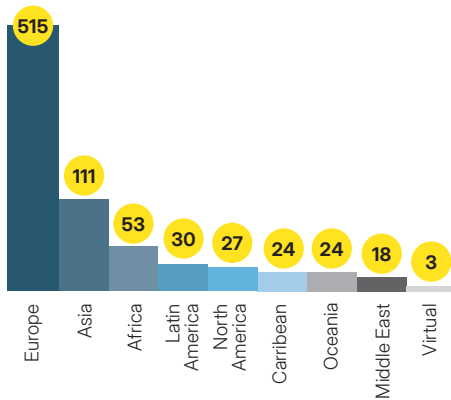

An English major with minors in Biology and Journalism, Julia also studied Gaelic literature and connected with her Irish heritage.

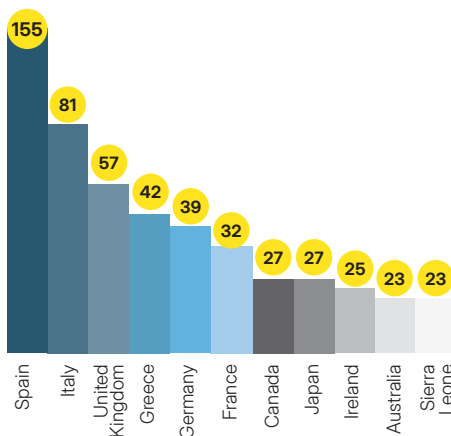
"Studying abroad was an incredible experience," she said. "It broadened my perspective and deepened my appreciation for my field and my roots."

Top Regions



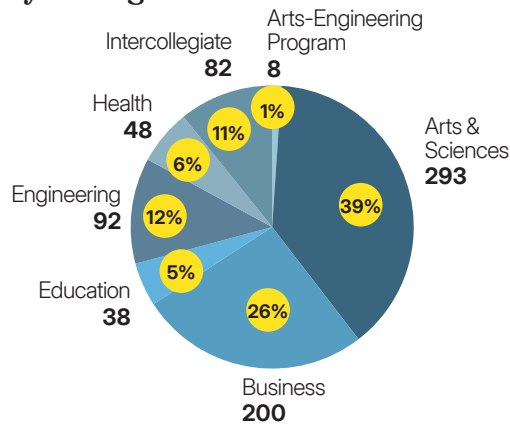
Top Countries



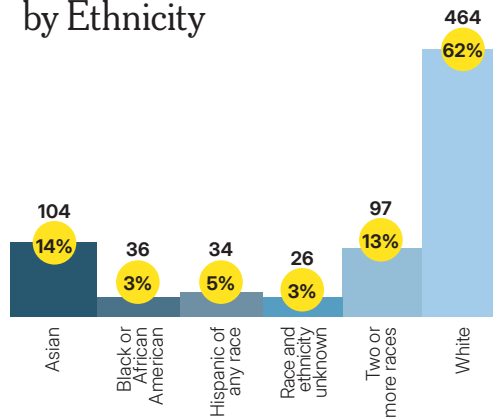

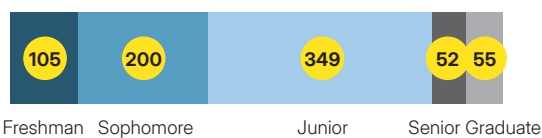
Participants by College

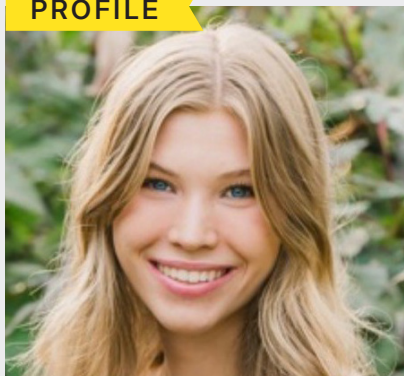


Zena Meighan '24
