While there, you will attend briefings, present at conferences, and network with high-ranking UN officials, all on behalf of your NGO. Lehigh's UN Youth Representative Program is a truly unique experiential learning opportunity, one that allows students to put their education into action outside the classroom in the service of an NGO that shares their interests and commitments.

Responsibilities

As a Youth Representative, you are expected to:

- Take on extensive reading to familiarize yourself with the NGO
- Establish regular communication with the NGO (via email, Skype, etc.) regarding their goals for you at the UN
- Attend *three trips per semester* to the UN in New York at your own expense
- Write briefings that report to the NGO on the meetings attended
- Meet with ambassadors and other UN representatives relevant to your NGO
- Attend monthly meeting on campus with the UN Program Assistant Director

You can expect your NGO to:

- Complete all the necessary UN paperwork to certify you as a UN Youth Representative
- Provide you with the educational tools and information necessary to represent the NGO

Qualifications

- 3.2 GPA or above
- Available to travel to the UN in NYC three times per semester (usually Thurs or Fri)
- A keen interest in international activities and proven ability to work independently
- Strong interpersonal/communication skills
- Must be available to serve for the entire 2018-19 academic year
- Under the age of 32 (per UN requirements)
